Over the last seven months, God’s plan has been made more clear to us and we now **know** that we are called to serve as missionaries. Our plan is to move to Kigali, Rwanda in January, 2012 and serve there with our family for two years. The journey to discover what God has in store for us has been amazing so far and yet it has only just begun...

WHAT WILL WE DO THERE?

We will work with FMWM (Free Methodist World Mission). There are over 200 Free Methodist churches in Rwanda. Scott will spend most of his time teaching courses to over 100 pastors who lack the opportunities and funds to attend appropriate pastor training. Natasha will initially focus

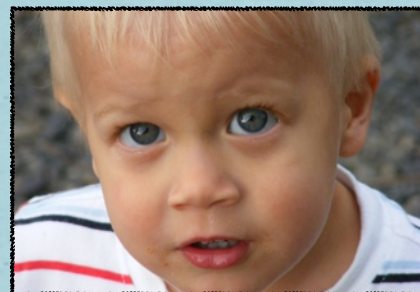

HISTORY OF RWANDA

Most people think of the tragic genocide in 1994 when they think of Rwanda. About one million Tutsi people were killed by the Hutu people. The nation's infrastructure was brutalized during the conflict, but the country is now stable and

rebuilding. Financial recovery is encouraging; Rwanda is currently one of the fastest-growing economies in Africa. Ethnic identification (Hutu, Tutsi) has been banned and Rwandans now refer to themselves only as Rwandans.
